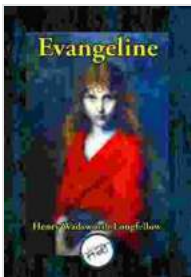


Tender Pitt Poetry Series: Henry Wadsworth Longfellow

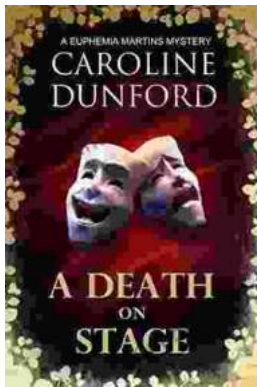

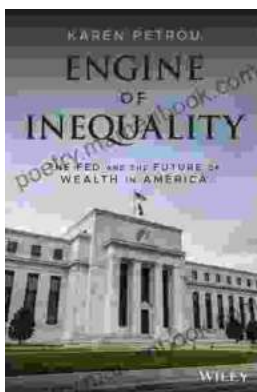
